Imagine you have just arrived home after a long day and you fumble to unlock the door. When you step inside the house you hear an eruption of voices calling out, "Surprise!" The house is filled with family and friends, balloons, and more food than you've ever seen. Suddenly your plans for the evening have changed and nothing else matters.

This image can give us a good idea of the way God works sometimes. He's not always neat and organized. Sometimes he likes to leave things a bit messy. For example, Amos was just a shepherd when God called him unexpectedly to travel to Samaria and prophesy. It was unexpected and disrupted Amos plan dramatically. But how excited he must have been to receive such a calling! Imagine how excited he must have felt as he stood before the priest Amaziah and spoke God's Word.

Similarly, the disciples must have been pretty excited when Jesus told them to go heal the sick and cast out demons in his name. They must have been even more excited when they discovered that they really could do such things!

Today's second reading gives us the astounding truth that God has already lavished his grace on us. Imagine your heavenly Father says you are worth divine grace. It's right there for you to take hold of it. So go ahead and grasp it-right now! Turn to him in prayer and listen to what he is saying to you. He may lead you to places you hadn't planned to go. He may open doors to new relationships or a new ministry. Whatever he has to say, it is a message of grace, love and promise.

God's grace may come in unexpected way, but it always given generously. So receive it generously as well. Your Father has great plans for you!!

ABOUT OUR FAITH

Q. I have seen people, including priests, bow toward the altar and the Blessed Sacrament instead of genuflecting. Shouldn't we genuflect if we really believe in the Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament?

A. *Genuflection, bending one or both knees as an act of reverence, happens to be the act of reverence Catholics of our time and country are most accustomed to. But a profound and devout bow can be just as reverent. Until perhaps 300 years ago, bowing was the common way of showing reverence to the Eucharist, the altar or to the crucifix. It was considered proper, in fact, for young girls to curtsy to the Blessed Sacrament. Our practice of genuflection derives mainly from practices of Imperial Rome and later the courts of Europe. A deep profound bow is the perfect alternative to a genuflection, especially for those who suffer from arthritis, back or knee or other health issues.*

Homily of Card. Tarcisio Bertone

Altar of St. Jerome, Vatican Basilica, Wed. Oct. 11, 2006

Pope John XXIII's message is still extraordinarily timely today. His life, his Discourses and his actions bring us to the heart of the faith and the heart of Christian commitment. As we know, one of Pope John's most important decisions was to convoke the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, which was inaugurated on 11 October 1962 here in St. Peter's Basilica. The Church, in his view, has a motherly face: her task is to keep "her arms open to receive everyone". She is a "home for one and all" that "desires to belong to everyone, and in particular she is the Church of the poor, like the village fountain", with no distinctions of race or religion. The Church's holiness and human wisdom are expressed very clearly in what is called

"The Daily Decalogue of Pope John XXIII".

- 1) Only for today, I will seek to live the livelong day positively without wishing to solve the problems of my life all at once.
- 2) Only for today, I will take the greatest care of my appearance; I will dress modestly; I will not raise my voice; I will be courteous in my behavior; I will not criticize anyone; I will not claim to improve or to discipline anyone except myself.
- 3) Only for today, I will be happy in the certainty that I was created to be happy, not only in the other world but also in this one.
- 4) Only for today, I will adapt to circumstances, without requiring all circumstances to be adapted to my own wishes.
- 5) Only for today, I will devote 10 minutes of my time to some good reading, remembering that just as food is necessary to the life of the body, so good reading is necessary to the life of the soul.
- 6) Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it.
- 7) Only for today, I will do at least one thing I do not like doing; and if my feelings are hurt, I will make sure that no one notices.
- 8) Only for today, I will make a plan for myself; I may not follow it to the letter, but I will make it. And I will be on guard against two evils: hastiness and indecision.
- 9) Only for today, I will firmly believe, despite appearance, that the good Providence of God cares for me as no one else who exists in this world.
- 10) Only for today, I will have no fears. In particular, I will not be afraid to enjoy what is beautiful and to believe in goodness. Indeed, for 12 hours I can certainly do what might cause me consternation were I to believe I had to do it all my life.

To conclude: here is an all embracing resolution: "I want to be kind, today and always, to everyone". In this way, we can put Pope John's hope for every Christian into practice: "Every believer in this world must be a spark of light, a core of love, life-giving leaven in the mass; and the more he is so, the more he will live, in his innermost depths, in communion with God."



CCD Registration

New Registration or non-registered application

The Religious Education program fee is \$125.00 per year per student (each additional child in the same family is \$30.00 per child). You do not have to register in the parish. If you continue with our program for a year and register in the parish using weekly envelopes you will pay the re-registration price the following year. **A Baptism certificate and a copy of your child's birth certificate and any other sacramental certificates must be presented at the time of registration.** (even if the child has been baptized in St. Andrew, you must produce a Baptism certificate).

Re-Registration: For students Already Enrolled this past year, the fee is \$80.00 (for each additional child \$20.00) You must be registered in the parish and have used the weekly offertory envelopes for the past year. Please include your envelope number . **Registrations must be completely filled out including tuition before acceptance.**
